ABOUT US

The Florida Department of Health is nationally accredited by the Public Health Accreditation Board and works to protect, promote, and improve the health of all people in Florida through integrated state, county, and community efforts.

CLINICAL & NUTRITION SERVICES

Family Planning

Well-woman exams, pregnancy tests, and birth control counseling. Birth control education is provided to men and women of child-bearing age. A variety of birth control methods are available.

Breast & Cervical Cancer

Early Detection program for women 50 to 64 years old with low income that meet eligibility requirements. Program offers free or low-cost cancer screenings and referrals for treatment to eligible women.

Hepatitis Services

Screening and education available for Hepatitis A, B, and C. Immunizations available for Hepatitis A and B. Chronic Hepatitis B and C clinic that includes provider visits, labs and assistance getting medications.

HIV/AIDS Services

Confidential HIV counseling, testing and treatment. HIV related care to include laboratory, medications, and co-pay assistance. Referrals for specialty care, mental health, housing, substance abuse, oral health, and nutrition services for qualified individuals.



PrEP Program

Confidential counseling for people at high-risk for HIV infection. PrEP used with other prevention methods, reduces the risk of HIV infection. Medication and co-pay assistance available.

Medication Assistance Programs

Programs to assist low-income individuals who need help buying their insulin or epilepsy medication. Applicants must meet income guidelines and be uninsured (including Medicaid) or have insurance that does not cover the medication or a deductible/co-payment they cannot afford. A recent prescription and proof of identity, income, and insurance is required.

Sexually Transmitted Infections

Testing including confidential or anonymous HIV testing, prevention, diagnosis, treatment, and counseling.

Immunizations

Free immunizations for eligible children aged 0-18 years old. Immunization records (DH Form 680) for school registration are available. Free or low-cost adult immunizations are available based on eligibility.

Women, Infants & Children (WIC)

Free program for eligible women, infants, and children (under age five) that provides healthy foods, nutrition education, and counseling and breastfeeding support. Refers participants for health care and community services.

EEDING BABIES BABIES PRICES

Healthy Start

Free home visiting program for pregnant women, women between pregnancies, and infants through 3 years old to

reduce infant and maternal mortality by identifying risk factors associated with preterm birth, low birth weight, infant mortality, and poor developmental outcomes. Provides education, support, and linkage to community resources to ensure a healthy pregnancy and birth outcomes. To enroll in the program, please call 407-891-9199.

School Health

Conduct annual student health screenings in Osceola schools for vision, hearing scoliosis and body mass index (BMI). Review health and vaccine records. Host events in Osceola County schools to provide immunizations.



OUTREACH AND PREPAREDNESS

Health Promotion

Promotes and coordinates community engagement and partnerships to improve wellness and promote healthy behavior. Offers chronic disease prevention education and screenings and assesses community specific health needs. Staff available to attend community events.

Emergency Preparedness

Partners with public and private agencies to ensure essential services are available during disasters. Outreach to vulnerable populations and the community to promote disaster preparedness.



DISEASE CONTROL & PREVENTION

Epidemiology

Monitors all reportable infection diseases/conditions and provides guidance to control and prevent future outbreaks. Conducts follow-up investigations for illnesses that can spread in water, food, and through animal exposure in an effort to identify the source.

Refugee Health

Provides no-cost health screenings, immunizations, and referrals to those individuals that meet eligibility guidelines.

Sexually Transmitted Disease Program

Provides testing for sexually transmitted infections, including anonymous HIV testing, treatment, counseling, prevention education, and community outreach.

Tuberculosis (TB) Program

Provides education, coordinated care and case management for individuals diagnosed with active TB, including a detailed contact investigation to prevent and identify potential outbreaks. Offers preventive treatment for latent tuberculosis infection (LTBI) to those who are eligible.

Environmental Public Health

Prevention of disease through routine monitoring, education, surveillance, and evaluation of

sources that may contribute to the occurrence or transmission of disease. Issues permits for public and private wells; inspects cafeterias in schools, jails, lounges/bars (that do not serve food), public swimming pools, septic systems, mobile home parks, RV parks, assisted living facilities, tanning salons, body piercing and tattoo parlors. Tracks and monitors animals for rabies investigations. Investigates complaints about insects such as mosquitoes, that can spread diseases to humans.



BIRTH AND DEATH CERTIFICATES

Provides certified copies of Florida birth and death records, applications for amendments to birth certificates, paternity attestations, and apostilles. Birth certificates are also available at select tax collector locations.



FINANCIAL ELIGIBILITY

All clients are screened to determine if they are eligible to receive services at a reduced or no cost, based on established guidelines. A financial eligibility determination requires household income documentation and is valid for up to one year. Clients who decline financial eligibility are required to pay the full amount for any services received.
